IT HAS BEEN A LONG HOT SUMMER

On the local weather last evening they stated Atlanta has had 71 days of temperatures of 90 degrees or higher so far this summer with more to come this week. This compares to 38 days during the summer of 2009. Quite a difference. No wonder our dahlias wouldn't grow properly this summer and many of them died or were stunted. Then there were the fungus diseases, spider mites, cucumber beetles and all of the bugs that love our dahlias. It's a wonder that we have any plants or flowers left. **But we do!** Our dahlias have started growing again and are blooming (at least some of them) and we will have blooms until frost. This is the payoff for all of our hard work and the many frustrations of the heat and bugs.

If you haven't started using a bloom enhancer now is the time to do so. Any fertilizer with a low nitrogen number, less than 10, and a high phosphorus number will work. For stiff stems use a high potash number. You don't want to use too much nitrogen unless there hasn't been any rain and we haven't had much so far this month. Remember that your dahlias need more water when they are forming buds and blooms are opening. You can keep spraying your plants every week to ten days to keep them looking good and to keep the bugs away. Enjoy your blooms the rest of the season and remember to share them with others.
