**APRIL MEETING** The April meeting will be held on Monday, April 17th at 7:30 PM in the Garden Classroom, located in the basement of the main building. Each tuber must have a visible eye, listed in the Dahlia Classification Book in the last three years and the name of the dahlia must be written on the tuber or attached in some manner. If you knock an eye off the tuber just circle it with a magic marker so we can tell where it was. At least two more eyes will begin to grow in a few days. If you can, please bring your tubers early so we can start the sale on time.

## MEMBER QUESTIONS

**Q:** It is so warm here in April can I go ahead and plant my dahlias?

**A:** You can but...you need to consider if the soil temperature is 70 degrees or not. Dahlias not already growing need the soil to be warm enough in order to sprout roots. Also, consider what will happen if we have a few days of 50/60 degree temperatures and wet weather.

**Q:** Can I replant dahlias in the same area year after year? Or do they need to be relocated?

**A:** Good question. One of our members always had a great dahlia garden so we were looking forward to seeing the beauty of many dahlias in bloom. When we went to where the dahlias were planted we were shocked as over half of his dahlias had failed to grow or had died during the summer. What was the issue? When you plant in the same location year after, you need to reduce the soil fungus that builds up as it is just too much for dahlias planted in that location.

What can I do to prevent this issue? The first thing you can do is let that area stay fallow for a year. Second thing you can do is to add Mycorrhizae (good bacteria) to the planting hole. That will help but I am not sure if that will reduce it enough over the years. The third thing you can do is to spray your soil before planting or after planting when they are about one foot high with Banrot or the one I use is Terraclor WP. Commercial growers spray their plants four times a year with this fungicide to keep the soil fungus at bay. These fungicides are rather expensive.
